




SO...WHAT'S BEEN HAPPENING DURING THIS HALF TERM?

Thank you so much Westholme School for your invite, and best of luck with the performances this week!




CLIMATE ACTION PLAN

'Mum has had Osteo and Rheumatoid arthritis for a number of years, and has struggled for some time now with her grip, finding new ways to open jars, clean her teeth and put her medication tablets in her mouth. When Olivia gave her Grandma the toothbrush handle, she was thrilled and amazed that someone, never mind her own Granddaughter had thought to make something to assist her with such a simple daily activity. Mum says cleaning her teeth is so much easier now. It's great to think our learning project made such a difference to someone's everyday life.'

NATIONAL SCIENCE WEEK

This half-term has included the annual "British science week". This year

has been extra special as it is the 30th anniversary! The theme this year is "time" and BSW have been encouraging schools and communities to celebrate the importance of time and how the world has changed since BSW started in 1994!

Staff in the science department made use of the BSW resources packs and planned activities to do with their classes surrounding time. Mr Butler spent a lesson talking about the history of the universe with his y8s and building a timeline of events, this included an opportunity for the pupils to reflect on their own journey so far; creating a personal timeline that allowed them to discuss with each other pivotal moments throughout their life so far and how that has helped them become the person they are today.

With his Year 7s, he challenged them to build a course out of what they could find around the room to make a marble roll down a slope and take a specific time. The pupils showed excellent teamwork, creativity and problem-solving skills! Unfortunately, none of them managed to get the time but some of them came close using a variety of different methods – including rolling up paper towels to create a slope and using a glue stick lid to create friction and slow down the ball!

Year 8 have just wrapped up the "Light" topic – as part of BSW some members of the department created pinhole cameras with their classes. Pinhole cameras are very simple and allow light to be focused onto a piece of tracing paper to create an image! With the right chemicals these images could develop into actual photos!


To make a pinhole camera you need to do the following:

- 1. Find a small cardboard box.
- 2. Cut a square out of the back and the box and place a piece of tracing paper over it.
- 3. In the front of the box create a pin-sized hole.
- 4. Point the box at the object you want to look at if there is enough light you will see the image produced (upside-down) on the paper.

You can adapt this method to produce real images by placing photosensitive paper behind the pinhole instead of cutting the back of the box out! Though you will need to create a shutter to cover the pinhole so light stops getting onto the paper! You'll need to sit there for about 5 minutes so an image can develop – it does take time!

Year 7 and 8 were also invited to take part in this year's poster competition which has some excellent science related prizes – the deadline for this is the 28th of March. Good luck to any of the pupils who will have been entered.



National Careers Week Assemblies:

We had a variety of speakers and activities all linked to careers to inspire our pupils for their future. For our Year 10 pupils, The Army presented to them during an assembly about their own personal career journey's along with all the roles available within the organisation. We were very fortunate to have two of our parents in to present in assembly to our Year 8 & 9 pupils, about Avanti trains and careers with a Geography focus. Our year 10 pupils were visited by Cardinal Newman College in preparation for their Year 10 Sampling Day where they will be visiting the local colleges for a day at the end of June.

Year 7 Careers Scavenger Hunt

Our Year 7 pupils had an assembly to encourage them to think about what careers are available to them in the future and the future jobs and careers that will be emerging in the Lancashire area. They then embarked on a 'Scavenger Hunt' around the school, where they were given a variety of questions with a few clues to aid them on their way! They used the career journey information that staff had displayed on their doors to find out about previous jobs and careers along with their journey after they finished school. This generated some excellent discussions about jobs and careers that staff had in their past and also jobs that pupils hadn't heard of! It was also very interesting to see what staff wanted to be when they were younger to see how ideas change over time!





Army Enrichment Visit

A selection of our Year 9 & Year 10 pupils went for an Army Experience Day at Fulwood Barracks this term.

Pupils had a presentation at the start of the day to find out about the range of careers in the Army and heard from Army personnel about their career journey's. They then participated in activities in Tag Archery and completed an assault course, where the aim was to work together as a team.


